and a whole host of other important things... like being humane.

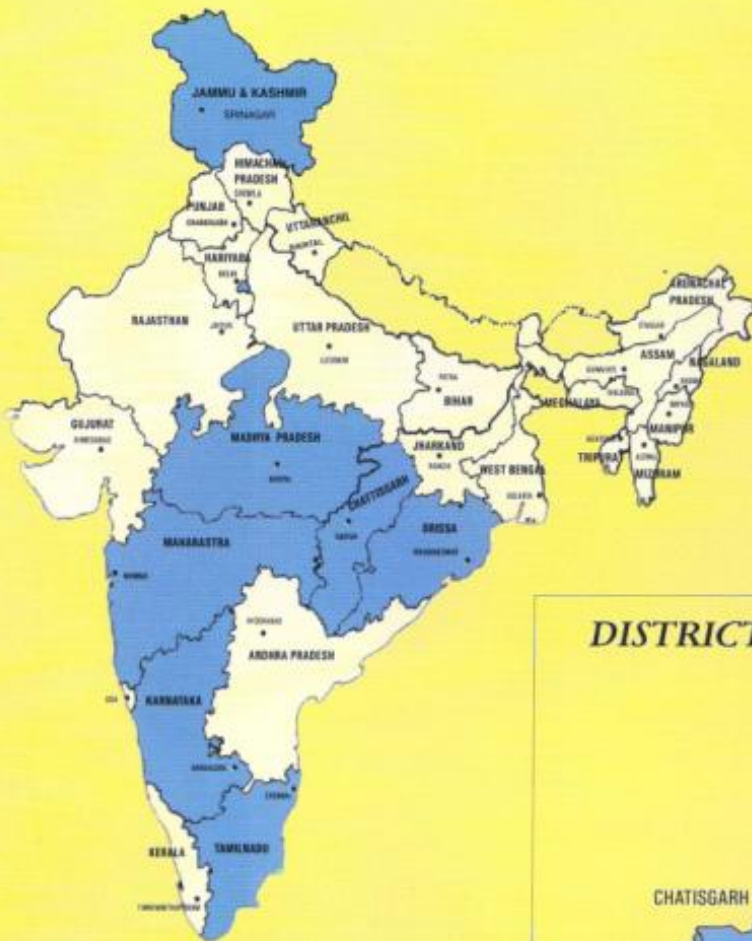

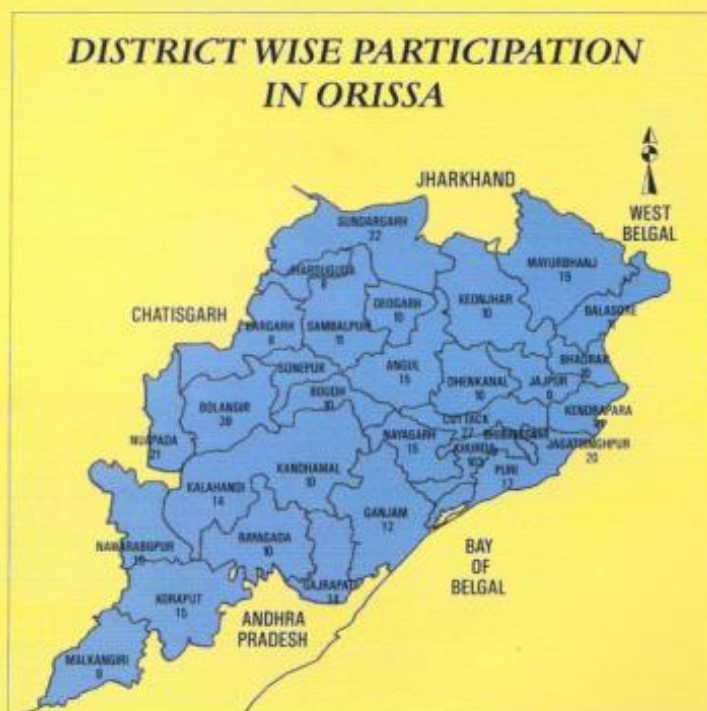

Anjali Award for Service :

Workshops

Ranging from artistic fervor to scientific interpretation of life a total of 12 workshops were organized keeping in concern the interest of the children. While workshops like Dance, Music, Craft, Fine Art, Pottery, Terracotta, Puppetry, Theatre, Sand Art and Creative Writing were exclusive attempts to polish and prop up the creative potentials of children from all walks of life, Space Science workshop provided them a rare opportunity to explore the world through the eyes of science. Nature's Workshop aimed at unraveling the mysteries of nature and enhancing their outlook towards it. Workshops like Photography and Filmmaking & Appreciation were educating and entertaining as well. Eight of the workshops were rotational and the rest five were fixed ones. Outside each and every product centred workshops, show cases were made so that children could exhibit their outputs.

Dance Workshop:

Resource Persons- Ms. Rosalin Mohapatra and Mr. Ramesh Ch. Jena from the Odissa Dance Academy are two artists with great repute in this field and they have several awards to their credits while performing at the state and National level.

Physically and mentally challenged children like Ravi, Anjana and many more were there at the dance workshop proving it with their convincing and captivating performances time and again. Besides, children from orphanages and street children enthralled all with their dances. In the dance workshop 123 children danced to the rhythm of life and joy.

Music Workshop:

Resource Person: Mr. Pradeep Ku Das is a well-known figure in the field of music. Presently working in Utkal Sangeet Mahavidyalaya, Mr. Das has produced many talents through his able guidance.

Music is the soul of life. For children from all walks of life, it was a huge platform and splendid opportunity to learn some basics of music and to perform as well. Children in the music workshop made some enthralling performances. A total 104 children participated in this workshop. The chorus presented on the valedictory day was a saga of Orissa's culture, valour and of children as our future.

Theatre Workshop:

Resource Person: Mr. Naveen Parida is a popular theatre artist. Presently working in Utkal Sangeet Mahavidyalaya, Mr. Parida has produced delights with his creative guidance and has staged hundreds of shows.

That language is not the only medium of expression- appeared apparent in the arts of children participating in this workshop. A total of 92 children were engaged learning the language of art. From articulating ideas and emotions through drawings to making those vibrant with the application of colors, children learned all the nitty-gritty of paintings.

Craft Workshop:

Resource Persons: Mr. Arun D. Phatak and Mr. Gajanan Tukaram Rajput from Maharashtra are classic craftsmen. They have been resource persons since 2001 and under their guidance children both disabled and non disabled produced captivating craft works.

In the Craft Workshop there were 86 participants who learned to produce wonders from waste papers. Each and every child made masks according to their liking and creatively decorated those with relevant colors to give a natural look. Besides, the colorful flowers made by the children attracted all. Children also learned designer candle making.

Nature's Workshop:

Resource Person: Mr. S.K. Pattnaik, ex-chief conservator of forest (Orissa) possesses profound knowledge on nature. He is presently the President of WWF-Orissa Chapter.

In Nature's Workshop, children were able to enhance their understanding about the world they are living in. The activities of this workshop included quiz on nature, sit and draw, learning about the foot prints of animals and knowing about natural history. Besides as a part of the activities children visited Regional Museum of Natural History. A total of 61 children including 33 children with disabilities participated in this workshop.

Children were taught about the basic concepts of rocket making like nose-con and booster tunnel and quite successfully they developed some miniature models which were launched as well. A total of 29 children learnt and developed skills of creative writing. In the 'Mystery Mania' children wrote stories after being given a situation like place, character and action. The writings of these tender aged writers promised talents within. Besides, their poems showed their passions and prowess in literature. In 'Fantasy Fiesta' children wrote stories based on their fantasies.

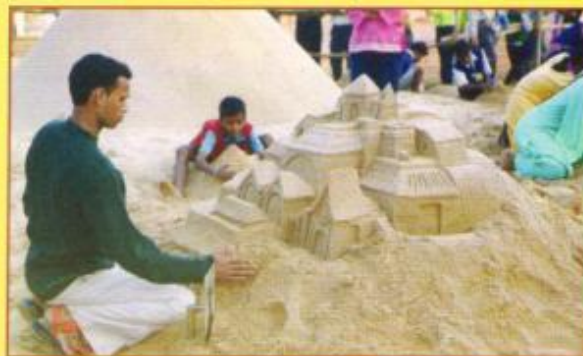

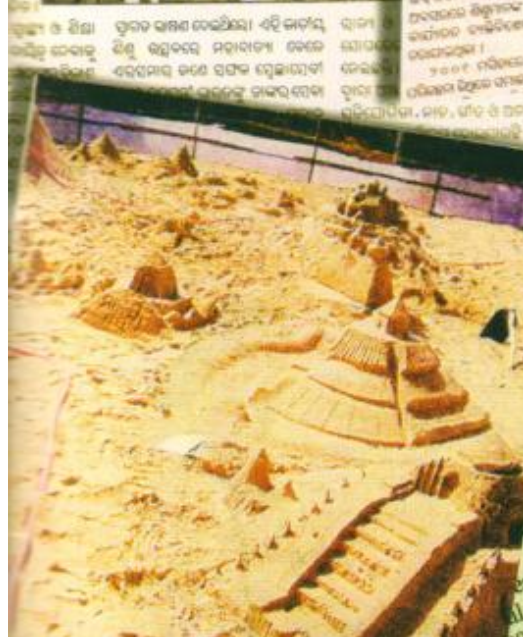
