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ADVOCACY

Barrier Free Ravenshaw University - The Ravenshaw University, Cuttack, received Rs. 92,66,500/- for creation of barrier free environment for the differently-abled persons under the scheme for implementation of PWD Act, during the financial year 2007-08. In order to provide appropriate consultancy to the Ravenshaw University, Swabhiman was appointed as the consultant to Ravenshaw University for implementation of the project in September 2010. Swabhiman guided and supervised the architects, engineers; planned a department of disability studies; and helped organize awareness workshops.

District Information RTI Applications

All 30 district collectors were asked for information about the status of disability pension being disbursed, bus passes issued etc. to PWD in respective districts. It was a frustrating experience as all letters were forwarded to various departments, they forwarded further and thus created a huge web of forwarded applications with little response. It was a defensive mechanism which reflected volumes on the incompetence of government in addressing disability issues. RTI applications were filed by Ranjan Kumar Parida, ex-Staff of Swabhiman in the year 2010-2011.

Deliberations on New Law

On 30th April 2010, Hon'ble Minister for Social Justice and Empowerment, constituted a Committee to draft a new and comprehensive Disability law for the rights of 70 million disabled people of India. Swabhiman played an active role throughout both the process of drafting and taking it around every sector of population with disability and service providers for a wide ranging discussion and feedback.

Excerpt from Draft Law

After consultation the sub group on Preamble and definitions decided that whilst mention of the UNCRPD shall be made in order to explain why the union was making a Disability Rights Law, a substantial part of the preamble shall be evocative in content. The evocative part of the Preamble should highlight that disability is an evolving concept which could not be exhaustively and permanently defined. The preamble shall also recount how disability was an integral part of human diversity and why the contributions of persons with disabilities needed to be duly recognized by the Indian polity. The role of the Preamble would be to create another image of PD rather than the existing stereotypical image. This positive rhetoric would assist in educating judges and administrators when they encounter disability related cases for the first time. The preamble could thus become an important instrument of awareness raising. It was decided that the Preamble should be crafted by drawing upon the principles formulated by the civil political rights group and human rights instruments. Such an evocative preamble was considered necessary to set the tone for a rights based statute insofar as it would guide both the State and the civil society on how disability rights needed to be understood, interpreted and implemented.

Political Advocacy

Letters were sent to all political parties in the state to motivate their members in both houses of Parliament to ask questions on disability.

Being governed by four laws, our needs keep shifting from one to the other without benefits accruing to us. The existing legal and administrative structures provide the worst type of barriers for the disabled to access our rights. A single, comprehensive law is the need of the hour. Further, a universal identity card must be provided so that disabled citizens can access his or her rights anywhere in the country. We would like to bring to your kind attention that very few members of parliament raise disability issues there. We would request you kind self to intervene and ensure that these issues are raised in Parliament.

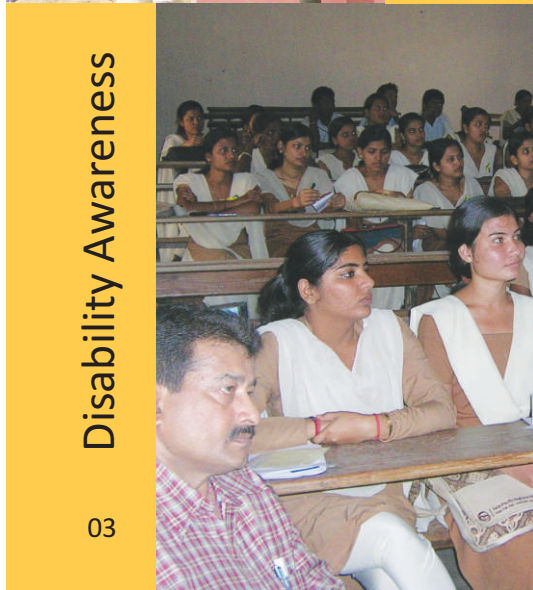
AWARENESS RAISING ROUND THE YEAR ACTIVITIES

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Campus Cleaning

Disability Awareness

Student wing of Swabhimana (SANDHAN-BJB) did an awareness drive on disability for their faculty and peer groups in April. The awareness campaign started at 9 am in front of college canteen, of arts block Sandhan members were well informed volunteers and explained queries of visitors. More than 40 people visited the stall and were informed about disability issues, potential and problems faced by persons with disabilities and the impact of disability on society and country's economy. Shri D.K Nayak, Reader of Education, wrote "I have very little idea about disability but by involving myself with Sandhan group now I have some knowledge and it is very nice that the students are voluntarily working for this cause."



Save Water

On 12th of April 2010 around 45 students of CSSR College (Student wing of Swabhimana) divided into six different groups visited different households. They imparted the message on proper use of water and waste disposal. One of the local residents Diraj Kumar Behera said "from today onwards I will try to use less water in the month of summer."About 80 houses were visited.

Awareness programs form an integral part of Swabhimana's activities. In the month of May, all SANDHAN chapters, in a collaborative effort, enacted a play to create awareness on the issues affecting the life of a youth with disability.

International Day For Persons With disabilities

To participate in a national convention of persons with disability a delegation of 10 members, including 6 persons with disability, 3 escorts and one sign language interpreter, went to Delhi. Disabled People's Conclave was held at IDSA-Institute for Defense Studies & Analysis. It was organized by NCPEDP and DRG. On the first day (1st December) renowned activists (PWDs) and experts spoke on the need for one comprehensive law over four laws which was followed by open house discussions in the light of the new law. On the second day participants attended 12th NCPEDP-SHELL HELEN KELLER Awards ceremony and in the later half of the day participated in various discussions on issues like employment, health, education and accessibility. 3rd December saw a huge congregation of disabled people at India Gate. About 5000 persons with disability, escorts, professionals, supporters and civil society members, from across the country stood shoulder to shoulder raising slogans of unity. Shri C.Chandramouli, Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India addressed the gathering and spoke on Census 2011 and steps being taken to ensure the correct numbers.

Bhubaneswar (Master Canteen Square)

Master Canteen Square - 'Colors of Love' commenced in front of Congress Bhawan in the morning hours of 3rd December. SANDHAN, student's wing of Swabhiman, did its day long celebrations to commemorate World Disability Day. The celebrations aimed at communicating to society at large the importance of inclusion and diversity and to invite all to express solidarity for the cause of the differently abled. Activities began with a 'Your Expressions on World Disability Day' and playing with colors. The use of blue and yellow balloon and colors was to highlight the colors that stand for the rights of the differently abled. ANJALI scholars Mithilesh Patnaik (Down's syndrome), Shakti Swaroopa Bir (Speech & Hearing Impaired), Rosaline Choudhry Orthopedically handicapped) and Munna Dharua (OH) interacted with public. WCD Secretary Smt. Arti Ahuja and popular TV anchor Sulagna visited the awareness booth. Disability bows were pinned to all passer bys. Awareness material was distributed to public on various issues of disability. 50 students from 5 colleges, BJB Autonomous College, Bhubaneswar; Biju Patnaik College of Social work, Bhubaneswar; Centre for Social Science & Research, Bhubaneswar; Institute of Media Studies, Bhubaneswar and Ravenshaw University, Cuttack.

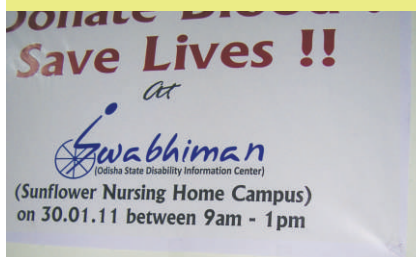


CHALLENGE, CREATIVITY and CHANGE – II - 2011 Art Workshop

The Activity was held on 23rd of March. This activity was an effort to restore the vanishing art of letter writing using art as a tool, alongside developing abilities to relate to other children from diverse backgrounds. As games and group activities are methods by which children learn to relate to others. Playing games, laughing and conversing with each other they built up relationships by sharing each other's problems, likings and disliking. Children, disabled, non-disabled from mainstream; and non-disabled orphans were encouraged to interact and; learn and know each other. The ultimate goal was to nurture friendships through acknowledge diversity and accept difference. This understanding found reflection in artworks on post cards which were given by them to respective friends and even to be posted by them every month to continue this friendship.

CENSUS CAMPAIGN 2011

The disability sector had to fight a prolonged battle to get disability included in Census 2001. The achievement of Census 2001 was the inclusion of the question on disability. However, at most places, it was reported that the enumerators did not ask the question on disability. The figure that emerged was persons with disabilities being only 2.13% of the Indian population, which was way off the mark. To further improve upon the same for the upcoming census, a round table on Disability and Census 2011 was convened at New Delhi. Dr. C.Chandramouli, Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India briefed the representatives (NGOs working on disability and disabled activists from more than 20 states and union territories of India) of Census 2011 and which was followed by interaction with the Commissioner. The two days deliberation dwelled on: Census questionnaire, the question on disability, training and sensitization of enumerators, awareness within the disability sector; amongst disabled people and families, advocacy with the central, state govts, media, private sector and all others. Dr. Sruti Mohapatra represented Odisha in the deliberations. The Census training happened in four tiers – National trainers (Delhi & Mumbai) who trained MTFs (Master Trainer Facilitators) at state capitals, they in turn trained District Officials (who would be working as charge officers) and Master Trainers who train the enumerators. In a spirit of volunteerism Swabhiman joined hands with Regional Census Office to train both District officials and Master Trainers. The training module was translated to Oriya and a three day training and mock drill session was held in Swabhiman office. A hand out was prepared in Oriya which focused on the 'non-counting' of persons with disabilities over the decades and about question no. 9.Constraint of manpower and money power did restrict Swabhiman in training enumerators as this was an extensive exercise and was done simultaneously in several districts. Still Swabhiman volunteers, whenever they got a call rushed to train enumerators within our limits. Thus we trained enumerators in Sundergarh, Ganjam, Jagatsinghpur, Sambalpur and Bargarh.

Get Yourself Counted – was launched with the support of WCD Dept. and Regional Census Office, Bhubaneswar.

On 18th January a state level consultation and press meet was held with participation from all thirty districts. About 100 persons with disabilities, NGOs working in the field of disability, community based organizations, disability activists and representatives of development organizations met at Mahanadi Conference Hall of CYSD in Bhubaneswar.Bishnupada Sethi, Director Census Operations, Kasturi Mohapatra, State Commissioner Disability and Sruti Mohapatra Chief Executive, Swabhiman lead the discussions. Arti Ahuja, secretary WCD addressed through a video message. Between 20th January to 5th February, 30 district workshops and press meets were organized. It was followed up with small group discussions at taluk/ block/ panchayat/ village level, along with poster campaign, distribution of leaflets and handouts.

TRAINING PROGRAMS

Sign language training was held for Anjali volunteers from 4-6th January. The three day training was conducted by Mr. Pramod Mohapatra, sign language interpreter of Orissa.

SPECIAL PROJECT – ANJALI

The ninth edition of the country's only national children's festival, Anjali, commenced on 10th November 2010 at Adivasi Exhibition Grounds, in unit I, Bhubaneswar and continued till 14th November. It ended in a happy note with participation from 17 states and all thirty districts of Orissa. 900 participants (children, escorts and volunteers) were present in the camp for 5 and ½ days. 1700 students from 17 schools visited the camp.

From science modeling, collage making to quiz; from music to dance, the festival encourages group competitions over solo performances to foster bonding among children.



Carnival of Love

Modeled after the popular Goa carnival, nearly 3000 children and adults from various parts of the country took to the streets in large numbers, donning colorful costumes, crowns and masks as the sound of trumpets and drumbeats echoed in the background. Children with painted faces, dazzling dresses and other accessories such as masks and feathers carried huge banners of the festival as they danced through the roads from Ram Mandir Square to Adivasi ground. Another major attraction of the procession were three elaborately decorated floats carrying children in many costumes. The carnival was flagged off by Ms. Arti Ahuja, Secretary of WCD department and Paramita Mohapatra, director of IMFA.

Anjali believes in inclusive and joyful learning- learning beyond the boundaries of classroom and knowledge that textbooks fail to provide. 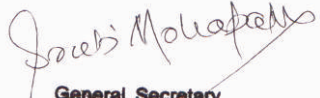

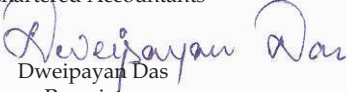
